THE Names of the Freeholders are arranged in the respective Wapentakes and Towns where they reside; and for the convenience of persons not acquainted with the division of the County into Wapentakes, an Index is added containing an Alphabetical List of the Towns, with references to the pages of the Poll Book. Those Freeholders who do not reside within any Wapentake of the County, are also arranged in their places of residence, an index to which is added. Where the Voter's residence, and his Freehold are in different Townships, the situation of his Freehold is separately mentioned.

In arranging the Wapentakes and Towns for the Press, Mr. Tuke's Map of Yorkshire and Nomina Villarum, were usually resorted to for the orthography of names, and the relative boundaries of Wapentakes. Morley, Dewsbury, Alverthorpe, Methley, Ossett, and some other towns which polled in the Agbrig Booth, are transferred agreeably to Tuke's Map and Nomina Villarum, into Morley.
