1. **Ervin Foster Rice**-1_[1] was born on 06 Dec 1827 in NC. He died on 23 Mar 1907 in Goosepond, Jackson County, Alabama.

Notes for Ervin Foster Rice:

General Notes:

Erwin (Ervin) Rice was a native of North Carolina as were his parents of three children when they were enumerated in the Federal Census. Louisa's mother lived nearby as did her brother, James David King. A year later, the Civil War came and in the Spring of 1862, Ervin and his brothers-in-Law, James David King and Henry J. Hamilton enlisted. There was intense recruiting for volunteers to fill the ranks of companies raised near their homes; but the three kinsmen by marriage, chose to travel across the county to where Captain Moses Lee was raising a company of volunteers at Mount Polk. It was here that on April 22, 1865, they volunteered for Confederate Service.

In early May, Captain Lee led his volunteer company to the tiny village of Auburn, Alabama. On May 22, 1862, Captain Lee's company and nine other companies from across Alabama were officially mustered into service as the 48th Regiment of Alabama Infantry. A few miles west on the same day, the 47th Alabama was also mustered into service. A week later the two regiments left for Virginia. From the day of departure until their surrender at Appramatox, the twin regiments were never separated.

The reigments arrived in the Confederate Capitol at Richmond, VA the last week of June, 1862. Here they were attached to "Stonewall" Jackson's command, but because neither had any combat experience, both regiments were assigned to guard duty during the fighting before Richmond that is now known as the :Seven Days War".

During July, there were two-a-day drills and about the first of August the command departed for Gordonsville by rail. From there, General Jackson marched the troops toward Culpepper. Late on the hot, sultry Saturday afternoon of August 9, 1862, the leading elements encountered Federal troops commanded by General Nathaniel Banks. After a fierce two hour artillary duel, fighting began sometime after 4:00 p.m.

The 47th Alabama became exposed to fire from the flank and rear when a seasoned brigade on its left broke. The 47th hastily retired as did the 48th. Both later returned to fight and salvage their pride. From there, the unit participated in the major battles in Virginia, Maryland and Pennsylvania.. Each time it performed valuable service.

Ervin was elected Third Lieutenant in July 1863, an participated in the Battle of Gettysburg, Pennsulvania. He was detached service when the 48th was sent to Chickamauga, Georgia, but was present in the ranks through 1864. He was promoted to First Lieutenant in November, 1864, with his rank to date from November 14.

Toward the wars end, confederate muster roll records were not rigorously updated or frequently lost. It is not know when or why Lieutenant Rice left service. He was not present at the surrender. sometimes in early 1865, Ervin Rice made his way home and resumed the life of a farmer.

In late 1865, followers of the Baptist religion decided to establish a church in the Nance Creek Valley. Formal proceedings to organize were held December 1, 1865, John York was appointed moderator. He was assisted by Ministers of the Gospel, T. F. Potter and James A. York and Williams Defreese, a deacon. The original church roll consisted of members from sister churches in the neighboring settlements. These were:

The original membership called itself Baptist Church of Christ. On October 16, 1895 the membership

changed it's name to Nances Creek Baptist Church.

In the 1870 census of Calhoun County, Ervin and Louisa were enumerated in the Jacksonville Post Office District. Ervin was listed as a farm laborer and did not list any real estate or property value. Five children lived at home, ranging in age from 1 to 18 years.

By the year 1880, Ervin and Louisa had moved to Cherokee County where they resided in Beant Number 7 when enumerated in the census. Three more children had been born in the Rice family. Ida, just 9 months old when the census was taken, had been born when Louisa was past 47 years of age.

Louisa died before 1889, and Ervin remarried. He and Elizabeth Jett were married on Onvember 11, 1897. The couple left for Texas in early 1897; but returned to Alabama by the year 1900. Ervin and Elizabeth were enumerated in the 1900 census of Jackson County. They resided in Precinct Number 21, where 72 year old Ervin served as a Justice of the Peace.

Ervin Foster Rice died March 23, 1907. A year later, elizabeth resided in Marshall County, Alabama where she applied for a pension from the state of alabama for a widow of a deceased Confederate soldier. J. B. Reynolds and John B. Baird submitted affidavits on her behalf stating that each was personally aquainted with Elizabeth and that she had not remarried after her husband's death. On August 8, 1908, the State Board of Examiners reviewed the application and granted the pension.

He and his wife lived in Ranges 8 & 9 of Calhoun Alabama in the 1860 Census of the White Plains Post Office district. Childre with him wereJoseph M. (8 yrs old), Sarah E(3 ysr old) & Margaret A. (8 months old) Census dated July 16, 1860.

In the 1880 Census Ervin is listed as being born in NC as are both parents. His mother -in-law Elizabeth King is also living with the family.

48th Regiment, Alabama Infantry

48th Infantry Regiment was formed at Auburn, Alabama, in May, 1862, and in June moved to Virginia with 1,100 men. Its companies were recruited in the counties of Jackson, De Kalb, Cherokee, Marshall, Blount, Colbert, and Calhoun. The regiment was brigaded under Generals Taliaferro, Law, and W.F. Perry, Army of Northern Virginia. It fought with the army from Cedar Mountain to Cold Harbor except when it was detached with Longstreet at Suffolk, Chickamauga, and Knoxville. The 48th was involved in the battles, skirmishes, and hardships of the trenches of Petersburg north of the James River and ended the war at Appomattox. It reported 73 casualties at Cedar Mountain, 50 at Second Manassas, and 42 at Sharpsburg. Of the 374 engaged at Gettysburg, more than twenty-five percent were disabled. In the Battle of The Wilderness it lost 11 killed, 30 wounded, and 8 missing, and during the Petersburg siege, June 13-December 31, there were 9 killed and 24 wounded. The unit surrendered with 14 officers and 122 men. Its field officers were Colonel James L. Sheffield; Lieutenant Colonels Jesse J. Alldridge, William M. Hardwick, and Abner A. Hughes; and Majors Enoch Alldridge, C.B. St. John, and John W. Wigginton.

The 48th Alabama Volunteer Infantry Regiment

enlisted for three years at Auburn, Alabama, on 22 May 1862, with 1097 men recruited from Blount, Calhoun, Colbert, Cherokee, DeKalb, Jackson, and Marshall counties. A few weeks later it reached Virginia and was attached to Brig. Gen'l William B. Taliaferro's Brigade, Maj. Gen'l. Thomas J. 'Stonewall' Jackson's Division, with the 47th Alabama, and three Virginia regiments. The 48th Alabama's first combat was at Cedar Run (9 August 1862) where they suffered severe loss (73 casualties); at the 2nd Battle of Manassas, it again suffered severely (50 casualties).

The regiment was part of the investing force at Harper's Ferry, and it was hurt badly at Sharpsburg (42 casualties). During the winter, the 48th was placed in the Alabama Brigade of Brig. Gen'l Evander McIver Law (with the 4th, 15th, 44th, and 47th Alabama Regiments), Hood's Division, Longstreet's

Corps. The regiment was under fire at Fredericksburg, and it fought with only slight losses at Suffolk.

The 48th Alabama Regiment moved into Pennsylvania and was "fearfully punished" in the assaults on Gettysburg (they reported more than 25% casulaties of the 374 engaged). Ten weeks later, as a part of Longstreet's Corps, the regiment was engaged at Chicamauga (20 September). It was engaged at Lookout Valley and at Knoxville; and it passed the winter in East Tennessee.

Rejoining the main Army of Northern Virginia at The Wilderness (5-6 May 1864), the 48th performed ably but lost heavily (11 killed, 30 wounded, 8 missing). From that time to the end, at Hanover Junction, the 2nd Battle of Cold Harbor, Bermuda Hundred, Petersburg, Fussell's Mill, Fort Harrison, Darbytown Road, Williamsburg Road, and Farmville, the 48th was almost constantly on active duty. During the last half of 1864, they lost 9 killed, and 24 wounded. The 48th Alabama surrendered 136 officers and men at Appomattox Court House, having lost over 150 in battle, 165 in service, and 125 who were discharged or transferred.

northeast Alabama, the 48th Alabama became known as the mountaineer regiment. Its first and only colonel, James Sheffield of Guntersville, expended a significant portion of his considerable wealth outfitting the companies. After organizing and electing field officers at Auburn, Alabama, the 47th and 48th became part of Stonewall Jackson's famed "foot cavalry." Both regiments remained in camps around Richmond during the Seven Days fighting between June 26 and July 2, 1862. The 48th suffered through the humiliation of being driven from the field in its first engagement at Cedar Run, Virginia. In the fighting at Groveton and Second Manassas, the once green regiment displayed the courage of seasoned veterans. The Battle of Sharpsburg, Maryland proved costly in casualties. It then saw little action at Fredericksburg on December 13, 1862. In January 1863 Sheffield and the 48th Alabama transferred to Evander Law's Brigade, then accompanied the brigade to Suffolk, Virginia in the Spring of that year where nothing of consequence occurred. On July 2, 1863 Sheffield led the regiment in the fight for Devil's Den at the Battle of Gettysburg, Pennsylvania. Sheffield advanced to brigade command when Evander Law took over Hood's Division. At the end of the day's fighting the most junior captain commanded the regiment, the consequence of heat exhaustion and wounds among ranking officers. Sheffield commanded the brigade through the early months of 1864 before returning to Alabama on leave. Lieutenant Colonel William Hardwick led the 48th at Chickamauga. Lookout Valley and the East Tennessee campaign. While on leave in Alabama he fell into Federal hands, spending the remainder of the war in prisons. Senior captains commanded the 48th during the Spring of 1864 and into the summer. Its morale suffered. Discipline became poor and absenteeism rapidly became a problem. In July of that year Major (late colonel) William C. Oates took command. He proved the catalyst needed for the 48th Alabama to regain its fighting spirit. Before long significant improvements in morale and discipline were noted by Oates's superior officers. On August 16th, 1864 the 48th experienced its finest moment. Thrown into a breach in the lines, Oates led the Mountaineers in a charge against superior numbers. Oates bought sufficient time for re-enforcements to come, thus saving Richmond from certain doom. Success came at a high price. Oates lost an arm, effectively ending his military career. Many of the officers and men went down. The 48th saw considerable fighting in the defenses around Richmond in late 1864. After witnessing the Federal break through at Petersburg, Virginia the Mountaineers accompanied the Army of Northern Virginia in its flight to the west. At Appomattox, Virginia the once proud regiment surrendered 13 officers and 122 men. There was intense recruiting for volunteers to fill the ranks of companies raised near their homes; but the three kinsmen by marriage, chose to travel across the county to where Captain Moses Lee was raising a company of volunteers at Mount Polk. It was here that on April 22, 1865, they volunteered for Confederate Service. In early May, Captain Lee led his volunteer company to the tiny village of Auburn, Alabama. On May

22, 1862, Captain Lee's company and nine other companies from across Alabama were officially

mustered into service as the 48th Regiment of Alabama Infantry. A few miles west on the same day, the 47th Alabama was also mustered into service. A week later the two regiments left for Virginia. From the day of departure until their surrender at Appramatox, the twin regiments were never separated.

The reigments arrived in the Confederate Capitol at Richmond, VA the last week of June, 1862. Here they were attached to "Stonewall" Jackson's command, but because neither had any combat experience, both regiments were assigned to guard duty during the fighting before Richmond that is now known as the :Seven Days War".

During July, there were two-a-day drills and about the first of August the command departed for Gordonsville by rail. From there, General Jackson marched the troops toward Culpepper. Late on the hot, sultry Saturday afternoon of August 9, 1862, the leading elements encountered Federal troops commanded by General Nathaniel Banks. After a fierce two hour artillary duel, fighting began sometime after 4:00 p.m.

The 47th Alabama became exposed to fire from the flank and rear when a seasoned brigade on its left broke. The 47th hastily retired as did the 48th. Both later returned to fight and salvage their pride. From there, the unit participated in the major battles in Virginia, Maryland and Pennsylvania. Each time it performed valuable service.

Ervin was elected Third Lieutenant in July 1863, an participated in the Battle of Gettysburg, Pennsulvania. He was detached service when the 48th was sent to Chickamauga, Georgia, but was present in the ranks through 1864. He was promoted to First Lieutenant in November, 1864, with his rank to date from November 14.

Toward the wars end, confederate muster roll records were not rigorously updated or frequently lost. It is not know when or why Lieutenant Rice left service. He was not present at the surrender. sometimes in early 1865, Ervin Rice made his way home and resumed the life of a farmer.

In late 1865, followers of the Baptist religion decided to establish a church in the Nance Creek Valley. Formal proceedings to organize were held December 1, 1865, John York was appointed moderator. He was assisted by Ministers of the Gospel, T. F. Potter and James A. York and Williams Defreese, a deacon. The original church roll consisted of members from sister churches in the neighboring settlements. These were:

The original membership called itself Baptist Church of Christ. On October 16, 1895 the membership changed it's name to Nances Creek Baptist Church.

In the 1870 census of Calhoun County, Ervin and Louisa were enumerated in the Jacksonville Post Office District. Ervin was listed as a farm laborer and did not list any real estate or property value. Five children lived at home, ranging in age from 1 to 18 years.

By the year 1880, Ervin and Louisa had moved to Cherokee County where they resided in Beant Number 7 when enumerated in the census. Three more children had been born in the Rice family. Ida, just 9 months old when the census was taken, had been born when Louisa was past 47 years of age.

Louisa died before 1889, and Ervin remarried. He and Elizabeth Jett were married on Onvember 11, 1897. The couple left for Texas in early 1897; but returned to Alabama by the year 1900. Ervin and Elizabeth were enumerated in the 1900 census of Jackson County. They resided in Precinct Number 21, where 72 year old Ervin served as a Justice of the Peace.

Ervin Foster Rice died March 23, 1907. A year later, elizabeth resided in Marshall County, Alabama where she applied for a pension from the state of alabama for a widow of a deceased Confederate

soldier. J. B. Reynolds and John B. Baird submitted affidavits on her behalf stating that each was personally aquainted with Elizabeth and that she had not remarried after her husband's death. On August 8, 1908, the State Board of Examiners reviewed the application and granted the pension.
